AUSTRIA AWARDS

The following list is a selection of Fulbright Scholar grant opportunities to Austria. **The application deadline for all grants listed below is August 1, 2007.**

All Disciplines #8191

Grants are available for a flexible combination of lecturing and research in Austria for 4 months. Scholars with several years of teaching and research experience are preferred, as are proposals based on comparative approaches and issues.

American Studies #8192

Scholars can apply for a 4-month lecturing position in American Studies in areas such as literature, culture, history, society, politics, etc. The award rotates between host cities; the host for 2008-2009 is the University of Klagenfurt.

Austrian-Hungarian Joint Research Award #8193

This joint award offers scholars the opportunity to conduct research in the humanities or social sciences on the relationship between Austria and Hungary in collaboration with Austrian and Hungarian specialists. Grantees spend 2 months in Austria and 2 months in Hungary.

Fulbright-Diplomatic Academy Visiting Professor of International Relations #8194

A 4-month lecturing award at the Diplomatic Academy of Vienna in the areas of international relations, U.S. foreign policy and transatlantic policy.

Fulbright-Freud Visiting Scholar of Psychoanalysis #8195

Conduct research in human sciences, theory, application and/or practice of psychoanalysis at the Sigmund Freud Museum in Vienna and teach 1-2 courses or seminars at a Viennese host institution.

Fulbright-quartier21/MQ Artist-in-Residence #8196

An opportunity for creative artists in contemporary media to work in residence for 2-4 months with one or more of the cultural institutions associated with quartier21. Quartier21 provides support to institutions and initiatives within the MuseumsQuartier in Vienna, focusing on digital culture, fashion and design.

Fulbright/IFK Visiting Fellow in Cultural Studies #8197

Conduct research in cultural studies for 4 months at the International Research Center for Cultural Studies in Vienna. Projects should be interdisciplinary and comparative research in cultural studies and humanities relevant to Viennese, Austrian and Central European traditions.
