GERMANY AWARDS

The following list is a selection of Fulbright Scholar grant opportunities to Germany. **The application deadline for all grants listed below is August 1, 2007.** For information about these and other opportunities for research and teaching in Germany, please visit CIES online at www.cies.org.

All Disciplines Lecturing/Research Awards (#8252 and #8253)

Grants for junior or senior scholars to pursue teaching and/or research projects in Germany in a variety of fields for up to 10 months. Grantees receive round-trip travel and a monthly stipend of 1,500 to 2,050 Euro, plus an allowance for dependents (if applicable) and incidentals.

Fulbright-Leipzig Lectureship in American Studies (#8268)

Senior scholars teach one to two graduate level courses in American studies (American studies, history, politics, society, culture, literature) at the University of Leipzig. Grantees receive round-trip travel and a monthly stipend of 2,050 Euro, plus an allowance for dependents (if applicable) and incidentals.

Fulbright-Stiftung Wissenschaft und Politik Research in International Politics (#8259)

To support an American scholar performing research in Berlin in the areas of European integration and enlargement, European and Atlantic security and global issues; with opportunities for occasional lecturing. Grantees receive round-trip travel and a monthly stipend of 1,500 – 2,050 Euro, plus an allowance for dependents (if applicable) and incidentals.

Beginning Professional Journalism (#8256)

Young American journalists or recent graduates at the beginning of their careers can apply to spend 10 months in Germany conducting research and working in German print or broadcast media. Grantees receive round-trip travel and a monthly stipend of 1,300 Euro, plus an allowance for dependents (if applicable) and incidentals.

American Literature and American Studies (#8255)

A junior lecturing award specifically for recent Ph.D. graduates or Ph.D. candidates; grantees teach undergraduate and graduate courses in American studies (literature, language, culture, history, art history or film). Grantees receive round-trip travel and a monthly stipend of 1,800 Euro, plus an allowance for dependents (if applicable) and incidentals.
